Daughters of Norway

In the first years of the 20th century, many Daughters of Norway lodges formed throughout the United States, but over the next years, with economic difficulties, many had few resources to continue. Some disbanded in the 1930s and 40s, and the lodges of the Midwest Daughters of Norway merged with Sons of Norway in 1950. The "Daughters of Norway on the Pacific Coast" declined the invitation to merge, and since 1950 has been known as the Daughters of Norway. The women retained their independent organization with the same purpose as its founding in 1908: to preserve and share a knowledge of our Norwegian heritage with our children and our communities, and to build among our members a strong support system and bond of friendship.

The wish of Nordic-American women to seek out the traditions, history, and culture of their ancestry has grown stronger in recent years, resulting in the formation of many new lodges. The institution of a new lodge in Minneapolis, MN in 2010 was not only exciting, but historic - a lodge once again exists where the first Daughters of Norway lodge was established in 1897! Active lodges can be found in WA, OR, MT, CA, NV, SD, IA, MN, and ND. The Daughters of Norway today is as strong, vibrant, and supportive as it has been for more than a century!
