Keep collecting those stamps!!

What is Tubfrim?

It is an organization that for over 90 years has collected used postage stamps & calling cards. They resell these to stamp dealers, private individuals & collectors in Norway & many other countries. The funds go to health & well-being promoting measures for healthy & disabled children & young people in Norway & to fight against Tuberculosis.

How to Save for Tubfrim

1. Collect only cancelled postage & used phone cards in good condition.
2. Stamps that do not appear cancelled are accepted so please save them.
3. Cut stamps off the envelope so that there is a slight margin from the stamp edge (ca. 1/2"). DO NOT cut off the perforations!
4. If the stamps are found on an envelope or post cover over 50 years old-DO NOT cut it off, instead, the entire envelope should be sent.
5. Damaged stamps or phone cards are not accepted, they are worthless.
6. Stamps can come from any part of the world.

Bring any saved stamps to an in-person meeting & put in the box provided on the Welcome Table.

They are collected yearly at the end of the October meeting.

Shirley collected them after the October meeting. Thank you to all of you who saved.

Carol Nielsen: was in Astoria during Oct. & visited the new Nordic Heritage Park!





Ellen Costello: oldest daughter & husband completed the 450 mile Camino De Santiago Trail in Spain!

Gustavus Adolphus-Finland 6 Gustav II Adolf-Sweden 6



Celebrated as a flag day in memory of King Gustavus Adolphus of Sweden, who was killed on that date in 1632 at the Battle of Lützen in the Thirty Years' War. In the era, which was characterized by nearly endless warfare, he led his armies as King of Sweden—from 1611, as a seventeen year old, until his death in battle while leading a charge during 1632, in the bloody Thirty Years' War—as Sweden rose from the status as a mere regional power and run of the mill kingdom to one of the great powers of Europe and a model of early modern era government. Sweden expanded to become the third biggest nation in Europe after Russia and Spain within only a few years during his reign.

Icelandic Language Day Iceland-16

The goal of the day is to remember the importance of the Icelandic language within Icelandic society and celebrate its past, present, and future.

Icelandic is an Indo-European language, belonging to the group of Germanic languages. This group also includes Danish, Norwegian, Swedish, and Faroese. Of these languages, Faroese and Norwegian are the most closely related to Icelandic. The Icelandic language is notable for its relative stability over the past millennium: modern Icelandic speakers can read and understand the Icelandic sagas, written around a thousand years ago.

Icelandic Language Day is celebrated with an official program of events in the National Museum of Iceland in Reykjavík. The events include the presentation of the Jónas Hallgrímsson Prize. (an Icelandic poet and translator and a strong advocate for Iceland's independence from Denmark.)

The Einherjar are the chosen heroes who sit in Odin's Hall are the Einherjar. Today we honor those dead kin who gave their lives for Family and Folk. If you have friends or family who died in battle, visit their graves today, if that is not possible, drink a libation in their memory.

Veteran's Day is a federal holiday in the United States observed annually on November 11, for honoring military veterans of the United States Armed Forces. It marks the anniversary of the end of World War I. Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 when the Armistice with Germany went into effect.

International Children's Day November 20



Investing in our future means investing in our children – which is why the United Nations has designated every November 20 as Universal Children's Day. It's a time to promote togetherness around the world, awareness of the problems children face in every corner of the globe, and improve the welfare for all children.

Fathers are often given a tie on Father's Day, and this "compulsory" item has become something of a laughing stock in many Swedish families today. Personal celebrations and even public gatherings are encouraged on this day to mark the event. It is common to see people participating in Father's Day events and programs organized by local bodies.

Swedish people believe in pampering their dads on this day. They usually take them out for lunch, beer or to even a popular movie. Giving dad's favorite gifts is also a common practice among the Swedish people.

Lavish dinner and feasts are arranged to observe this day. Swedish culinary like cockerel, potatoes boiled with dill, Baltic herring fillets, fresh Swedish strawberries, apple pies, cinnamon buns and other lip-smacking dishes form the highlight of any feast

Queen Sonja's Visit to Minnesota

Queen Sonja visited Minneapolis, Minnesota for 4 days Oct. 20-23. Events included her first official visit with Gov. Tim Walz on Oct. 20. Queen Sonja attended the grand opening of Norway House's Innovation and Culture Center. On the 23 she visited The Norwegian Lutheran Memorial Church, also known as Mindekirken for its 100th Anniversary.

It's the day after Thanksgiving and the kitchen is an absolute wreck, covered from end to end with dinner and dining leftovers, and there isn't a clean spot to prepare a meal.

What does all this mean? It's time to eat over the sink, obviously! That's how the concept of a sinkie was born, people who dine over the kitchen sink to save themselves the stress of cleaning.

Heading home on the evening before Thanksgiving is an American tradition. And in preparation for spending the weekend with Aunt Martha and her pumpkin pie, the night before is often spent at a bar, catching up with old friends who are also back from out of town. In some cities, DrinksGiving is a more popular day for drinking than St. Patrick's Day or even New Year's Eve!

Recipe of the Month (Månedens oppskrift)

Indian Pudding



While it's certainly not the prettiest nor is it Scandinavian, Indian Pudding is good, simple comfort food and you'll be coming back for more! For a nice dinner, you could try making this dessert in individual ramekins. Sprinkle with more spices if you wish. Top with vanilla ice cream or whipped cream! If making Indian pudding in advance, just reheat in the microwave prior to serving. I made this & it is very good.

Ingredients

4 cups whole milk, divided
 1/2 cup yellow cornmeal
 1/2 cup molasses
 1/2 cup light-brown sugar
 4 tablespoons (1/2 stick) butter, softened
 2 large eggs, beaten
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 teaspoon ground ginger
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 300°F. Butter a 1½-quart casserole dish.
2. Bring 2 cups of milk to a simmer in a double boiler over high heat.
3. Slowly combine cornmeal to the milk. Cook for about 15 minutes, whisking frequently, until the cornmeal is smooth.
4. Slowly add the molasses, then remove from heat. Add brown sugar, butter, eggs, salt, ginger, cinnamon, and nutmeg, then stir until smooth.
5. Pour the mixture into the greased casserole dish, then pour the remaining 2 cups of cold milk over the top.
6. Bake for 2 hours, or until the pudding is firm and the top is browned.

Thanksgiving Leftovers Lasagna

YIELDS:10

COOK TIME:0 HOURS 40 MINS

TOTAL TIME:1 HOUR 0 MINS



INGREDIENTS

Butter, for greasing pan
 2 tbsp. bread crumbs
 3 c. prepared mashed potatoes
 2 large eggs, lightly beaten
 1 c. shredded Gruyère cheese
 1 c. chopped cooked green beans (or other leftover green vegetables)
 1 c. leftover shredded turkey
 1/2 c. cranberry sauce
 1/2 c. gravy

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease an 8"-x-8" baking pan with butter then coat with breadcrumbs.
2. Mix together mashed potatoes and eggs until smooth. Spread about one third of the mashed potato mixture into the bottom of the pan. Sprinkle with cheese then drizzle with gravy. Top with green beans, turkey, more gravy and cranberry sauce. Spread more mashed potatoes on top and sprinkle with more cheese. Top with stuffing then drizzle with gravy. Bake for 30-40 minutes, until the lasagna is warmed through.
3. Let sit for at least 15 minutes before serving. Serve with more gravy, if desired.


