looked amazing in an early 1900's white linen dress with hardanger work on the top and skirt. One of Marilyn's friends modeled Marilyn's own Swedish costume she wore for her wedding. There was a quick change and Zia had a chance to model a hardanger bunad with a wedding crown. We all had fun taking selfies with the wedding crowns! Marilyn also brought a ton of goodies to raffle off, there were lots of winners at the meeting. If you missed her in April, I will have her come back next year - she has stories and textiles to share about the Vikings!

Here are some tips from Marilyn about getting stains from your vintage linens. Test first and if your linen has red embroidery or red fabric keep a bowl of ice water handy to stop red from running. Make your repairs after cleaning, you'll have a better chance of matching the thread.

- Rust stains Whink
- General whitening -Oxyclean and boiling on the stove
- Stubborn stains -Whitening toothpaste rub it in the fibers
- Ink stains -Aquanet hairspray

And now a favorite recipe from a previous class... See what you missed!!!

NORWEGIAN KRINGLA COOKIES

Ingredients:

6 c flour 1 ½ c sugar 1 tsp vanilla 2 tsp baking soda ¾ c buttered softened 1 c buttermilk ½ tsp salt 2 eggs 1 c sour cream



Directions:

Mix flour, baking soda, and salt in a medium bowl, set aside. In a large mixing bowl combine sugar, butter, eggs, vanilla, buttermilk, and sour cream. Slowly add dry ingredients to the wet ingredients.

Place dough on a floured board and shape it into ball. Wrap in wax paper and chill for 2 hours. Preheat oven at 400 degrees. On parchment paper sheets, roll pencil thin, then 8 – 10" logs. Shape into figure 8's or pretzel like bows. Brush cookies with milk and sugar.

Bake for 8 minutes, Cool on sheets 5 minutes, transfer to cooling racks.
